BaptistCare does not administer substances or provide any services associated with VAD at our facilities in NSW. This includes our aged care homes.

Guided by our values, we understand every person's journey is unique and stand firm in our commitment to foster inclusive, self-directed care that embraces diverse backgrounds and beliefs with respect.

BaptistCare will not deny access to the process of VAD and will compassionately care for and honour the individual choice of residents and clients.

BaptistCare employees have been trained in our VAD policy and are supported to follow the appropriate procedures when required. Residents who wish to discuss these appropriate procedures will need to approach their Residential Managers.

BaptistCare is committed to our purpose to meet the needs of the thousands of people who trust us with their care. With our Christian values as a guide, we will continue to enable and empower every individual to live as well as they can for as long as they can.
